
## 17TH ANNIVERSARY MAP BLOCK PARTY



The class topics are as follows:





#### **COMMUNITY SERVICES - PARKS DIVISION**

Canyon Park is a true gem in our Community and our volunteers continue to keep it shining! When the pandemic ripped across the Nation, our Canyon Park Volunteers safely continued to keep the trails clear, safe, and ready for the return of our hikers. It wasn't long after we reopened Canyon Park, to allow safe hiking and recreating, we were hit with another disaster, the Bobcat Fire. This 116,000 acre wildfire ripped through our forest leaving a devastating layer of ash and burned vegetation across our park.

Our Canyon Park Trial crew was there to answer the call once again. Without skipping a beat they were on our trails clearing ash and debris slides, cutting away trees that fell on the trail, repairing retention walls that fell away from fire damage. Our volunteers have been out there after every heavy rainfall to assist with the clean up of mud and debris, fixing our trails and clearing overgrown brush. They continue to clear mud slides that fall on the trail after major rainstorms and support getting the trail back to safe hiking conditions.



Currently, our City Staff and Volunteers continue to work diligently to repair trails and remove hazards in an effort to open Canyon Park as soon as possible. To-date, the City Council has approved \$4.7m for costs associated with debris removal and clean up on Canyon Park and Lower Clamshell Trail. The vast majority of these costs will be reimbursed by the State of California and FEMA. The City has not hauled debris out of the park in efforts to reuse and repurpose the rock, dirt and even fallen trees to help build the park. For example, boulders were collected and saved, then placed along the streambeds to fortify against future erosion. Trees damaged by the Bobcat Fire or floods in 2021 and 2022 have been buried into any landform grading/earthwork, providing greater nutrient levels in the soil. Hydroseed included native grasses and wildflowers seeds, and were applied in certain areas of the park to protect against further erosion.

Our contractors also began work this month on the damaged rock wall just below the Nature Center in Canyon Park. The wall and surrounding roadway began sliding downhill this past spring. Unfortunately, the wall has moved enough that we needed to excavate a large portion of the roadway only to find that fixing the wall will mean removing large portions so we can install a proper footing since the rock wall sat on a foundation of piled rock, and lasted for decades. Fixing the wall means we have to take it down and rebuild.



In addition to the construction work, the City has partnered with Psomas for the environmental planning that we need to rebuild our park's natural features. They have been working in the park for several weeks doing a biological constraints analysis which is essentially a field survey of current site conditions and the true impacts of wildfire and flood on our park. They will also perform a tree risk assessment. With information in hand, they will develop a habitat recovery plan which will be a key component of our repair efforts in years to come.

#### **YELLOW TAGS**

In an effort to reduce illegal dumping and encourage proper disposal of bulky items, the City of Monrovia launched the #CleanMonrovia campaign. This is a multi-department strategy to provide educational resources to residents and to curb illegal dumping.

Code Enforcement Officers will be placing a yellow tag on dumped items and at the front door of the property if they are unable to make contact with the resident. These "yellow tags" have a step-by-step process to schedule a bulky item pickup with Athens Services so it does not become illegal dumping.

If you receive a yellow tag and did NOT schedule with Athens, please remove the item from public view and schedule a pickup with Athens. It will typically be the same day as your trash service. If you DID schedule a pickup you can disregard the yellow tag.

# Community Activist Policing Tip

## LIVING WITH BEARS

Now that it is officially summer time, wildlife in Monrovia has become more active. In particular, our bears are coming down for food and to look for places to cool off during the hot months ahead. Here are some safety tips on what the residents of Monrovia can do to help avoid a bear encounter.

- Don't feed bears, and don't put out food for other wildlife that attracts bears
- Be responsible about trash and bird feeders
- Burn food off of barbeque grills and clean after each use
- Keep all bear-accessible windows and doors closed and locked, including home, garage and vehicle doors
- If you must leave trash outside, buy a bear-proof container or build a bearproof enclosure
- Don't leave food, trash, or coolers containing food outside overnight
- Pick fruit before it ripens, and clean up fallen fruit, especially avocados

Bears don't like it when you yell, blow a whistle, clap your hands and make other loud noises. This will generally make a bear turn and go the other direction.

## **GRAFFITI**

Graffiti can significantly detract from the visual appeal of a city. It can make neighborhoods look rundown, neglected and unsafe. By removing graffiti promptly, a city can enhance its aesthetic appeal, create a more welcoming environment and improve its overall image. Uncontrolled graffiti can also create an environment that encourages further vandalism and criminal activities. Removing graffiti promptly sends a message that such activities are not tolerated, helping to deter further vandalism and criminal behavior.

Recently, many local cities have experienced an increase in graffiti, including Monrovia. It is a leading priority within the City of Monrovia to eliminate graffiti as quickly as possible! Code Enforcement conducts daily sweeps and make it a high priority to report any observed graffiti for immediate removal. The City also needs the help of residents and business owners to be additional eyes on the street and report graffiti when you see it! Here is how you can help your community rid of unwanted graffiti:

If you witness an individual in the act of vandalism, immediately call 9-1-1 to report the activity. If the Monrovia Police Department locates and arrests the suspect, the caller receives a \$100 bill.

## **VOLUNTEER WITH THE COMMUNITY MEDIA OF THE FOOTHILLS!**

The Ralph Walker Paid Internship at Community Media of the Foothill's KGEM Studio in Monrovia is for juniors and seniors in the Monrovia and Duarte communities. The internship is for students interested in the studies of journalism, communications, social justice, and broadcasting. The application will be available beginning on August 16, 2023 through September 15, 2023. Candidates will be interviewed October 2-15 for the January 2024 internship program.

This paid internship is in honor of the late Ralph Walker, a prolific producer at Monrovia's KGEM for over 30 + years. He hosted his show and reported on meaningful events, he created a historical media archive centered on humanity, freedom of speech and the utilization of public access TV.

Community Media of the Foothills / KGEM, a non-profit, public access organization, is memorializing Ralph Walker with this paid internship and has produced a feature-length documentary, "The Godfather of KGEM", that chronicles his 30+ year legacy of being a community activist and citizen journalist.

The paid internship will offer juniors and seniors at Monrovia and Duarte schools the opportunity to learn about how a public access studio functions and why it is vital to have a media access center available to amplify noncommercial community voices.

## LOG YOUR HOURS

Track it Forward is the program we use to track volunteer efforts. Volunteers can log hours via the web or mobile app, as well as sign up for events and track their progress for requirements.

- Encourage MAP Leaders to recruit their neighbors and get involved.


## **COMMUNITY SERVICE HOURS**
